

Sticky Note Wall Bop



Materials needed:

- An open area to throw a ball at
 - A wide wall or closed door works great!
- Sticky notes
- or your own diy sticky notes with recycled paper and tape
- Pen or pencil
- A soft ball or a small stuffed animal to be tossed

How to Play:

1. On sticky notes or recycled paper with tape, write the names of different landscapes or types of PNW Salmon. Your choice!
 - Landscapes
 - Desert, Plain, Tundra, Wetland, Mountain, Cliff, Coast, Glacier, Forest, Rainforest, Woodland, Jungle, Moors, Fjords, Island
 - PNW salmon types
 - Chinook, Coho, Chum, Pink, Sockeye, and Steelhead
 2. Post the notes on the open area of you choice
 3. Have players stand at least 2 feet away from the wall
 - Moving backwards to make it more challenging
 4. Have players say the word on the note card to practice pronunciation or ask questions in which the landscapes or salmon types are the answers
 5. And then they can throw the ball and try to hit as many corresponding note cards as they can pronounce or answer correctly.
- ★ This game's theme can be changed to anything as long as it has multiple vocabulary words to put on sticky notes.
- ★ A list of definitions for the landscapes and salmon species will be available.



Sticky Note Wall Bop

Landscape definitions:

Desert- barren area of landscape where little precipitation occurs and, consequently, living conditions are hostile for plant and animal life

Plain- flat, sweeping landmass that generally does not change much in elevation

Tundra-vast, flat, treeless Arctic region

Wetland-land consisting of marshes or swamps; saturated land

Mountain-large natural elevation of the earth's surface rising abruptly from the surrounding level; a large steep hill

Cliff-steep rock face, especially at the edge of the sea

Coast-the part of the land near the sea; the edge of the land

Glacier-slowly moving mass or river of ice formed by the accumulation and compaction of snow on mountains or near the poles

Forest- large area covered chiefly with trees and undergrowth

Rainforest-luxuriant, dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall

Woodland-land covered with trees

Jungle-an area of land overgrown with dense forest and tangled vegetation, typically in the tropics

Moors-a tract of open uncultivated upland; a heath

Fjords- long, narrow, deep inlet of the sea between high cliffs, as in Norway and Iceland, typically formed by submergence of a glaciated valley

Island-a piece of land surrounded by water

Types of PNW salmon:

Chinook, Coho, Chum, Pink, Sockeye, and Steelhead
